All Creatures Great and Small

This half term is an exciting time and we are looking forward to our Minibeasts and farm topic. With the good weather (hopefully) arriving we are looking forward to being able to do more learning outside.



<p>Communication & Language</p> <p>Children will have lots of opportunity to talk about the animals and farm visit. We also have some caterpillars arriving for the children to look at and describe changes.</p>	<p>Physical Development</p> <p>The children will be developing their physical skills. We will be going outside to practise with equipment, developing their agility and coordination. We will also be developing more accurate handwriting and cutting skills.</p>	<p>Personal, Social and Emotional</p> <p>Children will talk about how to keep themselves safe and what risks there are at the farm. They will also be learning about how to care for themselves and animals. We will be looking at feelings and talking about how we feel, and the consequences of our behaviour. For No Outsiders we will be reading 'Blue Chameleon' by Emily Gravett.</p>
<p>English</p> <p>Children will be reading a selection of non-fiction books about farms, and the animals that live on them. We will be reading Minibeast poems and reading 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. The children will retell stories in the correct order, talk about and compare the different characters, and say what they liked/disliked about the story. They will have the opportunity to write a list of farmer's jobs, and write fact sheets about different farm animals.</p>		<p>Maths</p> <p>We will be continuing to recognise and order numbers to 10. The children will be using money in their imaginative play and we will be encouraging them to use addition and subtraction vocabulary in their play. The children will have the opportunity to explore the capacity of different sized containers in the water tray and use language such as full, empty and half-full.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>This half term, the children will be using different materials and media to make animals. The children will be singing and playing nursery rhymes, becoming familiar with their structure and sound. They will also begin to use the glockenspiels to accurately play tuned percussion as a class.</p>	<p>Knowledge & Understanding of the World</p> <p>Children will be learning about how caterpillars grow and change into butterflies. They will also be learning about animals that live on the farm and finding out about where and how they live, what they like to eat, what their young are called and how they change and grow.</p> <p>The children will have the opportunity to recreate different roles in the vets and role-play farm.</p>
