

## **The Crescent Primary School – Sports Funding**

### **What is the Sports Premium?**

The Sport Premium is allocated to schools in order to improve the provision of PE and School Sport, and ensure that pupils may lead healthier lifestyles. The Crescent Primary School will receive £21,240 for the academic year 2023/24

### **What is the purpose of this funding?**

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

### **How does The Crescent Primary School use its Sports Premium?**

At The Crescent Primary, our vision is that our children will develop values and transferrable life skills based around key areas of development including personal, social, cognitive, creative, physical, health and fitness skills. Weaved throughout opportunities to take part in healthy competition is to provide all children with high quality PE and sport provision. It is our vision for every pupil to succeed and achieve their potential as well as to lead physically active lifestyles.

To help achieve this we use the PE and Sports Premium in a number of ways. We have continued to work with Solent University who have taken over the running of the Southampton School Sports Partnership. At present, we are in a Service Level Agreement with Solent to deliver an enhanced package of Sport Provision to the school (this includes additional sports clubs after school and various exciting activities like Mini-Warriors, Dance-Mats, Inflatable Assault Courses).

We are also in a Service Level Agreement with Create Development as part of their real Legacy initiative which endeavors to have long lasting impact on the provision of sport and physical exercise in schools. This includes a range of CPD opportunities for staff.

We have established a community link with Barton Peveril College – which involves groups of their sports students coming to school – to deliver a series of progressive, skill-based sessions. This provides an opportunity for local, aspiring sports coaches (some of whom are ex-pupils) to develop their coaching practice alongside the class teachers.

The Crescent Primary school has a specialist PE coach 4 days a week who delivers P.E. to Years R – 6 during PPA. The coach also runs a range of sports clubs throughout the academic year and is involved with lots of our fixtures and competitions.

JOLF has been a big hit with our pupils over recent years and we have agreed to extend our involvement with them next year. They will be providing additional leadership training sessions for groups of our older pupils, alongside the existing sessions we have in place.

These projects will be delivered in part through our school specific SLA agreement with Sport Solent Affiliation Package. Where opportunities are provided outside of this agreement, they will do so through the formation of new school club links with established, reputable local providers who are governed and regulated by their particular National Governing Bodies in line with the school’s Safeguarding policy.

## **Expenditure**

This year we subscribed to the RealPE essentials package (**£695**) but next year we plan to use some of the Sports Premium to subscribe to the Legacy package again – which will cost £4995 - lasting for 2 years. This cost covers the curriculum plans for RealPE, RealDance, Real Gym, Real Play, Real Leaders and also includes CPD elements to enhance our staff knowledge and delivery of high-quality PE lessons.

As detailed in the table above, we will be using some of the money towards:

- Updating equipment and resources
- Proportion of P.E. coach's salary (additional hours for clubs)
- CPD opportunities to gain coaching experience (long-term goal of additional qualifications) and work alongside experts

### **How does The Crescent Primary School use its Sports Premium to ensure there is sustainability?**

In order to promote sustainable outcomes in 2023/2024 for PESS, The Crescent Primary School are:

- Allocating our Sport Premium for 2024/2025 to support the School Development Plan.
- Ensuring CPD opportunities for teachers across each age phase.
- Promoting club links with those local NGB registered clubs who demonstrate a well-supported pathway into participation/ membership.
- Pro-actively providing opportunities for student volunteers/ trainees to work alongside school-based staff.

### **Swimming**

In the academic year 2023-2024, the pupils who were not deemed secure in the above areas, will be given an additional opportunity in the summer term to work towards these objectives. We plan to do this by booking additional instructor-led sessions using the PE and Sports Premium.
